Founded in 1876, Coppes Napanee is the oldest woodworking company in America. And since then, we've added pivotal moments to the history of the cabinet. We added a Lazy Susan to the kitchen's corner cabinet in 1942. We made the novel Hoosier cabinet in the mid-20th Century.

Located in Northern Indiana, where enduring quality and meticulous craftsmanship are a way of life, Coppes Napanee is celebrated for its contribution to the industry. In 2017, the Mast Brothers bought Coppes, continuing a tradition of family ownership. Now, the legacy of the pioneering spirit in craftsmanship lives on.

THE HISTORY OF COPPES NAPANEE



1873 Myers and Mellinger is the 1st saw mill in Nappanee.



1883 The first of the Coppes Factory buildings begins construction.

1883

Nappanee Furniture Co. begins

business with the purchase

of Mose Stahley's Furniture Company.



The Nappanee Furniture Co. introduces "kitchen cabinets" to their product line.



1920's Hundreds of kitchen cabinets shipped from Nappanee each week.



The "lazy susan" is introduced by Coppes Nappanee.

2000

The rights to the Coppes company name and equipment are purchased by Paul Harold.

2017 The rights to the Coppes company name and equipment are purchased by MastBros, LLC.

1882

John, Frank, and Sam Coppes purchase interest of John Mellinger in saw mill. Becomes Coppes Brothers Saw Mill.

1891

Daniel Zook becomes partner. Firm is named Coppes Bros & Zook.



Extensive line of furniture made at "Factory A", the site of Nappanee Furniture Co. Kitchen cabinets made in "Building C". Chamber sets (beds, etc) are produced in the old box factory, now "Building B".



1936

Company is incorporated

and name changed to

Coppes Inc.

Coppes factory operated by 2nd generation Coppes children. Harold & Claude Coppes, sons of Frank and Marvin, & Irvin Coppes, son of John Coppes.

1975

Coppes Inc. is purchased by Monarch Industries.

2007

Old Coppes factory building purchased for renovation by local businessman.

1876

John & Frank Coppes join brother-in-law, John Mellinger, at saw mill.



1885

The Nappanee Furniture Co. has shipped 1400 tables in four months.

1891

Samuel Coppes leaves Coppes

Bros. to purchase bank & then

build Coppes Hotel.

1902

New partnership between John & Frank Coppes, Charles & brother Albert Mutschler, and Daniel & son Harold Zook is formed. New firm named Coppes, Zook & Mutschler Co.

Dutch girl first used in advertising.

1916



1921

John & Frank Coppes purchase Harold Zook's share of the company. Company name then changed to Coppes Brothers.

1950-1970's

Coppes Kitchens becomes world famous for the quality of the cabinets produced.

1986

Company sold to the five men of the Nappanee investment group.

2000 -PRESENT


Coppes Napanee is the only manufacturer of Hoosier Cabinets still in operation today.




8 SOLID FEATURES

- 1. 1" x 1-5/8" Hardwood Face Frame
- 2. Full Mortise and Tenon Joints
- 3. 3/4" Plywood or Hardwood Exposed Cabinet Ends
- 4. ½" Plywood Cabinet Tops, Bottoms, and Unexposed Ends
- 5. ¾" Hardwood Back Rail with ¼" Plywood Backs
- 6. ¾" Hardwood Rail for Adjustable Sliding Trays
- 7. 5/8" Half Blind Dovetail Joints on Drawer Boxes and Adjustable Sliding Trays
- 8. Drawer Boxes and ASTs constructed of ½" Plywood Bottoms and 5/8" Hardwood Sides






